




Clean Air Act BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Clean Air Act of 1963 is a United States federal law designed to control air pollution on a national level. It is one of the United States' first and most influential modern environmental laws, and one of the most comprehensive air quality laws in the world. As with many other major U.S. federal environmental statutes, it is administered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Further amendments were made in 1990 under the presidency of George H.W. Bush, to

address the problems of acid rain, ozone depletion, and toxic air pollution, and to establish a national permit program for stationary sources, and increased enforcement authority. It also established new auto gasoline requirements to control emissions. Reviewing his tenure as EPA Administrator under President George H.W. Bush, William K. Reilly characterized passage of the 1990 amendments to the Clean Air Act

as his most notable

accomplishment.




